Variable

The variable name for each piece of data stored in your data set. These pieces of data include survey questions, survey administration information, recoded survey questions, and pertinent alumni information.

Item

Number for each question on the survey.

Other

Alumni could select "other" and type in their response in a text box if none of the provided responses were applicable, or if they wanted to add another response. This ensured that all alumni could answer every question they were asked.

Response could be entered in an open text box, with a limit of 50 for other text boxes and 2,000 for open-ended questions.

This value is only included when not everyone received a question. This was not a response option available to the respondents.

Respondents are only assigned these negative values up to the point at which they leave the survey.

Multiple Response Values Each of the response options

are stored as numerical values in the data set. This section indicates the correspondence between these numeric values and the survey responses available.

Alumni Receiving

Some questions were given only to alumni who provided certain answers to previous questions. This field explains who received certain questions on the survey.

If an alumnus/alumna skipped a question, they received all relevant follow-up questions.
